I have a lot of great memories with all my friends and just having a good time.

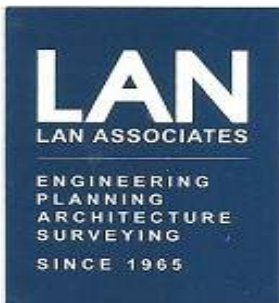
DANIELLE KING ('98) FARRELL:
